Human Rights & Freedoms:

Students will explore human rights and freedoms by examining relevant news stories, history and comparing Canada with other countries

Democracy around the world:

Refugees- An Introduction: Students will be introduced to the world of a refugee from reasons to leave to the struggles of settlement.

Refugees- Meet the People, Hear

Their Stories: With ample notice, CARE will try to bring along a cultural Consultant Volunteer who will share their stories of settlement and struggles.

Citizenship: Students will explore Canada's citizenship process and take a sample Citizenship test to see where their knowledge stacks up.

Exploring Immigration: Students will become a part of Canada's immigration process and learn the ins and outs of immigrating to Canada.

Meet a Newcomer: Students will be introduced to a recent newcomer to Canada to hear their stories and learn about their experience immigrating to Canada.

Working towards Inclusion:

Students will be challenged by different activities that build an understanding and awareness of the importance of inclusion.

Anti Bullying / Anti Racism: This program focuses on the Bully, the Bullied and the Bystander. All 3 roles are examined by discussion, activities, role playing and examples.

You Can Make a Difference!: This presentation focuses on examples of young people (6-12) that have made differences globally. Students are challenged to examine their lives and make differences locally or globally.
